**Education, training key to Effective Management: Fakhar Hayat**

## **Humanistic way of working, motivated by compassion, of Family Court Judges can save Family, society: Director General, FJA**

**Islamabad:-** The humanistic way of working, motivated by compassion and social far-sight , not mechanical way of working only, can save the institution of family and society from destruction.

This was stated by Mr. Fakhar Hayat, Director General, in the inaugural ceremony of a one-week training course on “Management of Family Cases” for Female Judges of the Family Courts from all over Pakistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan at the Federal Judicial Academy on Monday.

“We all are well- aware of the fact that we live in such a society where there is an estrangement between couples and their families over trivia. People often ruminate over trivia in this society and this myopic thinking between couples and their families take them to the court for a dissolution of a marriage and other family related matters. In this sordid state of affairs, it is only the children who bear the brunt. Your little devotion of time, not only in your capacity as Family Court Judges but also responsible human beings and citizens of this country as permissible by law, can inspire the estranged couples to reconcile and bring them closer for a happy life and a bright future of their children.”

Regarding the training importance and scope of the training, he said, “The main purpose of the capacity building courses and training activities is to build capacity and enhance the ability of the trainees for effectiveness in their working. In this training such subjects and topics have been incorporated which would be highly useful for your effective management of family cases.”

Twenty five female judges of Family Courts from all over Pakistan and Azad Jammu & Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan are undergoing this weeklong training at the Academy.
