Social Justice and Court justice go hand in hand: Raja Jawad Abbas Hassan

Registrar, Islamabad High Court asks judicial officers to be worthy of their God-given position, responsibilities, duties

Islamabad: A society like ours where social justice system is caught in the doldrums, there the relevance and responsibility of the courts immensely increases to deliver speedy justice to the justice-seekers.

Raja Jawad Abbas Hassan, Registrar, Islamabad High Court, expressed these views during the certificate awarding ceremony at Federal Judicial Academy at the conclusion of a one-week training course on “Skill-Based ADR Training and New Laws” for Civil Judges-cum-Magistrates from all over Pakistan, Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan on Saturday.

He said, “The court justice is nothing but a portion of the entire social justice and we can’t separate a “juz” (portion) from a “kull” (the entirety or totality). We all know that judgeship is a God-given job, therefore, judicial officers must prove themselves worthy of their God-given position, responsibilities and duties attached to it. “

He also sounded optimism about the participants’ effective learning during the weeklong training and the use of the gained knowledge, information and skills.

Mr. Fakhar Hayat, Director General, presented his welcome speech, a brief introduction of the chief guest and an overview of the training course. He enlightened the audience about the increasing significance of Alternative Dispute Resolution mechanism in our judicial system for quick delivery of justice.
